A Letter from the Executive Director

2023 was a year of transition and assessment. We took a look at how Main Street Medina could become more balanced in our approach to committees and work plans; operate events more effectively; better engage with our members; add value to our community partners; and attract new visitors



As a result, we invested more resources into visitor promotions and marketing; membership building and incentives; public space planning (particularly in South Town and holiday lighting designs); volunteer and committee engagement; diversified funding through grants, fundraising, etc.; and enhanced events activities.

For 2024, we will focus more on attracting visitors using new marketing tools; providing resources to small businesses (data collection/reporting, rehab grants/loans, collective services, etc.); developing public spaces in South Town; and building even stronger relationships.



In 2023, Angela Mansier, Events Director, targeted sponsor businesses to best fit our events; provided resources to benefit the food insecure at our 21 farmers markets; managed 35 events (introduced Fall Fest); and recruited new volunteers.

For 2024, Angela plans to secure most event sponsors and vendors by 2nd Quarter; grow a more diverse volunteer base to fill our needs; sell merchandise that visitors want; and benefit small business through cross promotions.

Strategy

The Board of Directors, committee chairs, and staff developed a multi-year strategic plan for Main Street Medina. In 2023, we adopted "Balance" as our Transformation Strategy.

Our overarching goals include these focus areas

- Diversify Sources of Funding: Grow revenue from a variety of new and existing sources to enable greater re-investment and impact in our community.
- 2. Raise Awareness for Main Street Medina; Position the Historic District and South Town as a Destination: Broaden community awareness of Main Street Medina's mission and impact locally while simultaneously attracting visitors from outside of Medina County to spend time in the District.
- 3. Connect & Engage Beyond our Boundaries; Be Inclusive of Diverse Audiences: Foster key relationships and drive collaboration with non-traditional Main Street Medina constituents to ensure diversity of thought is embedded in all organizational activities.
- 4. Develop Advocacy Voice to Advance Business Vitality, Historic Preservation & Community Spirit: Become recognized as a leading voice and contributor to positive change and historical preservation in and around the District.

About the Main Street Program

Organized in 2007, Main Street Medina, Inc. (MSM) is a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization and nationally certified Main Street Program. Heritage Ohio oversees the Ohio programs and provides resources and support. The National Main Street Approach is the guide that communities across the country use for its proven record of success.

Our "Footprint"

Main Street Medina concentrates our work and vision on the nine-block Medina Square Historic District, and the three-block South Town District, but reaches beyond our borders to include other strategic assets. Each month, we report on business activity, property development, public improvements, events and promotions, and volunteerism to determine the economic impact and annual return on investment to the community.


What is an Historic District?

Medina's Public Square was placed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1975. From its early days as a New England-style town featuring a central greenspace to today's vibrant hub for business, entertainment, distinctive shops and fine dining, Medina's Historic District has long been a visitor destination.

What is South Town?

The South Town District dates back more than 150 years when the Industrial Age sparked construction of the railroad to serve emerging grain mills, lumber and coal yards, and manufacturing sector. These were eventually replaced by the booming automotive industry in the 1950s. Today, South Town is reimagining its identity to be more visitor–friendly, with a unique blend of retail, restaurants, and services, while still honoring its industrial roots. The vision is to enhance the "visitor experience" by attracting artists, entertainment, and "nightlife" beyond what the Public Square and Historic District offers.



2023 Year-End Financial Report



In 2023, Main Street Medina moved the events budget under the MSM Events subsidiary to separate and evaluate them from other activities; hired Angela Mansier as full-time Events Director to better manage and coordinate events; invested in the South Town Design Plan project; increased the advertising budget to expand visitor reach and promote businesses; cleared merchandise inventory to reevaluate branding needs; and transitioned our membership database to DonorPerfect for better efficiencies. In 2024, MSM will purchase market research software to improve data collection and accuracy; dissolve the MSM Events subsidiary to streamline accounting; increase focus on grants and foundation funding to be less dependent on current income sources; and secure more funding for community development and economic vitality activities.


2023 Accomplishments

The **Design Committee** produced the annual holiday ornament design featuring the Interurban Depot; provided façade design renderings for Marks Cleaning and the Riztech building; received funding to install and maintain planters in South Town; assisted the City with selecting and installing holiday decorations; provided the City with a list of property and public space issues within the MSM footprint; and hired a consultant to propose three priority South Town design concepts: gateway design. Mill Street development, and pocket park installation.

The **Economic Vitality Committee** provided business support attending ribbon cuttings and recording business activity; provided marketing support through events, social media, third-party tools; provided new businesses with resources; and researched market data software, private transit, shared services, and new promo products.


The **Organization Committee** reviewed and revised policies, procedures, job descriptions, contracts, vendor applications, and roles/responsibilities; planned fundraisers: Beer Fest, Scholarship Golf Outing, and Annual Appeal/Giving Tuesday Campaign; and coordinated monthly membership renewals and canvased for new members, and planned the Annual Meeting/Awards Ceremony – Held event on Jan. 25, nominated awardees, and planned event.

The **Promotions Committee** planned 35 MSM-sponsored events including Cars & Coffees, Ladies Nights Out, Farmers Markets, Kids Day & Teen Fest, South Town Music Festival, Fall Festival and Candlelight Walk; held volunteer recruitment and training; promoted events through the media, social media, print ads, etc.; and assisted with events/activities sponsored by other organizations like the Ice Festival, Juneteenth, Pride Day, Christmas in July, and Wizarding Weekend.

FARMERS' MARKETS HIGHLIGHTS

The Medina Square Farmers Markets were held on Saturdays at Public Square from May 20–October 7. There were 73 vendors this season (53 full time and 20 part time) offering produce, pantry goods, baked goods, home and health products, prepared foods, snacks, and dairy/meat products. Angela and the Farmers Market was featured on New Day Cleveland!

The SNAP/Produce Perks Food Assistance Programs provides food-insecure customers access to fresh, local produce and pantry products. Produce Perks tokens are distributed free to eligible customers as a 1/1 match to their SNAP dollars up to \$25 per week.

In 2023, \$5,954 SNAP credits were distributed with \$5,557 redeemed; \$7,119 Produce Perks tokens were distributed with \$6,756 redeemed, with total distribution of \$11,318 and redeption of \$10,486. Also, \$2,315 Western Reserve Senior Coupons were redeemed at the market; and 138 \$30 WIC coupons worth \$4,140 were distributed. In addition, the market provided fundraising activities for Shop with a Cop (\$152), Salvation Army (\$363), Project LEARN (\$640), and 10 gallons of chili was donated to Cups Café.
